Business:

July 4th

The concert is set. Red Mud Run is being planned. L & L, K&K, and Pepsi are all making donations. Tommy Olsen proposed that we only use color powder at the end (instead of at the end and beginning). He said last year some people ran without paying. He suggested we changed the color of the shirt each year in order to tell if a person had paid. Brent Fenn said we have about 300 shirts and so we cannot change to different shirts at this time. It was suggested that we write numbers on participants arms in order to know if someone has paid. 4-5 people are needed to run the Red Mud Run registration table at 8:30 am. The race starts at 11 am. Brent Fenn will order wrist bands. Registration is available online. Brent will contact food vendors. JR Bird said there will be signs posted reminding people to social distance. Roosevelt City and Tri-county health will worry about any COVID-19 related liability. We may need a mass gathering permit.

June 20th there will be a concert by Pierce Sounds

Mark Winterton will need help with stage set up at 9 AM. He will also need help afterwards to take it down. Katy Scholes at Tri-County might have a youth group that could help.

Reports from Committees:

Recreation:

Disc Golf (3) has been ordered. NEC counseling has frisbees to give away/donate. The committee is working with BLM to lay out the Gusher bike trail. BLM will do an environmental study. It is a 4.5 mile will with some off shoots.

New baseball diamond construction in the center of the walking path will start in the fall and finish in spring 2021. JR Bird would like to involve the community in the construction. Phillip Bertoch wants to make sure that if the community is involved there is still a high standard of construction and construction materials. If the quality is poor, then the new park will not draw people to our city.

There is a proposed workout circuit to go along with the baseball diamond construction. The committee is looking into grants.

The committee asked if there were plans to replace the bike park that will be demolished with the construction of the new baseball diamonds. JR Bird said the city is looking into some alternative locations. They are considering purchasing some adjoining land.

Arts:

Missoula Children's theater has been canceled. Mindy Palmer might do a summer theater camp if we move to green status.

Itty Bitty Roosevelt started June 2nd. Winners will be announced June 18th.

Interfaith Concerts: no information currently.

Parks:

Most sports are put off. There is a possibility of doing flag football in the spring.

UBIC is cancelled. Tennis, softball, and basketball tournaments are still planned to move forward. Mark Winterton proposed a battle of the bands. JR Bird will talk to Chad Mortensen to make sure he is ok with sports events being planned during UBIC week.
