

# MINUTES OF A REGULAR ROOSEVELT ARTS, PARKS, & RECREATION COMMITTEE MEETING

## February 2, 2023 at Roosevelt City Offices

The meeting was called to order at 7:14 PM by Chair Preston Kadleck.

A roll call was taken which showed the following committee members present:

### **MINUTES**

A motion to approve the minutes of the November 3, 2022 meeting and the December 1, 2022 meeting was made by Jeramie Tubbs. The motion was seconded by Vanessa Oaks. The motion was voted unanimously in favor by committee members.

### **APR COMMITTEE MEMBER WELCOME & DEPARTURES**

The following were welcomed as new members of the Arts, Parks, and Recreation Committee with the following subcommittee assignments:

- Jacqueline McKee – Parks Subcommittee

Kianna Hamblin announced that she will be stepping down from the APR Committee at the end of her term in March.

### **ELECTION OF APR COMMITTEE TREASURER**

Chair Kadleck opened nominations for the election of the APR Committee Treasurer. Royce Porter nominated Cody Labrum. The nomination was seconded by Lianne Ames. No further nominations were made. The election of Cody Labrum was voted unanimously in favor by all committee members.

### **APPROVAL OF 4<sup>TH</sup> OF JULY CONCERT EXPENDITURES**

Lianne Ames motioned that the APR Committee approve the expenditure of \$7,500 from the APR Pooled Committee budget to pay John Chadwick from Cherry Peak for the production of the 4<sup>th</sup> of July main concert as discussed in the December 1, 2022 APR Meeting. The production would include a sound manager, performer Tim McKay, and a fireworks show. The motion was seconded by Vanessa Oaks. The motion was voted unanimously in favor by all committee members.

### **MOVING THE AUGUST 2023 APR MEETING DATE**

Juliann Richins motioned to move the date of the regular APR Committee meeting from August 3, 2023 to August 10, 2023 in order to avoid conflicts with Uintah Basin In Celebration events. The motion was seconded by Jacqueline McKee. The motion was voted unanimously in favor by all committee members.

### **SUBCOMMITTEE REPORTS**

Chair Kadleck reported that Winterfest events were quite successful this year, including a well attended Casino Night for the Rotary Club and 162 attendees at Family Bingo Night.

Juliann Richins reported that preparations for the community performance of *The Messiah* is underway. Practices will be held at Roosevelt Jr. High School. The Arts Subcommittee will propose for the APR Committee's approval the needed expenditures for the performance at the March APR Committee meeting.

The Arts Subcommittee is planning a Spring Fling vendor event for April 15 at the Crossroads Senior Center. Mayor Bird advised that the vendors either need to pay a suggested donation, like UBIC does, or the City Council needs to approve a vendor fee in the official fee schedule and all vendors would be required to pay it. Roosevelt City also pays for 7 rental days at Crossroads Senior Center each year. These could be utilized; they just need to be scheduled with the Crossroads staff.

Fall Festival is proposed for early October.

Uintah Basin In Celebration will be held August 3-5. The Parks Subcommittee is planning a pickleball tournament.

The venue of the 4<sup>th</sup> of July Run will be decided at the March APR Committee Meeting, possibly from the Nature Park to the walking path at Constitution Park. Chair Kadleck asked committee members to be prepared to share ideas for 4<sup>th</sup> of July activities at that meeting as well.

Mayor Bird suggested the idea of renovating the old city building at the intersection of State Street and Lagoon Drive into a city museum.


Royce Porter reported that the Beginners Pickleball League has been very successful in attendance and welcoming new players to the game.
